





Village* in Austin, Creekside is a neighborhood of tiny homes geared at being affordable for people experiencing homelessness. Housing alone will not end homelessness, but community will. The

goal is to provide permanent housing by keeping people off the streets and in community. KXA was delighted to serve in this way, clearing brush for construction and painting one of the first houses on site.
